A census of Nandipara in 1983 will be performed to document the increase in population. Base line data on some demographic aspects & on SES will be conducted by using standard questionnaires for 3 months which will enable to study the changes in the socio-economic condition of the people in the transition village.

SECTION II - RESEARCH PLAN

A. INTRODUCTION

1. Objectives:

The broad objective of the study is to collect base line data on SES & some relevant demographic aspects.

2. Background:

The village Nandipara is located at a distance of 6.5 kms. east of the centre of Dhaka Metropolita city. It is bordered on the west by a canal, on the south by an embankment road and on the north and east sides by paddy fields.

The location factor predicated that within near future this area will be overtaken by urban growth and agricultural activity will cease. We have termed this village caught in the middle of the rural to urban transformation "transition village".

Nandipara consists of a series of small islands of tightly clustered huts surrounded by paddy fields (flooded during the monsoon months). Majority are muslims (70%) and minority are hindus (30%), and its labour-force consists of share-croppers, farmers, casual labourers, rickshaw pullers etc. There are businessmen like artisans, retailers, moneylenders and also service holders (employees of either the Government or a Dhaka based private or public corporation).

First census was performed in September 1977 and data collection covered 3 areas: socio-economic, nutrition and parasite infestation.

A paper estimating price, income and household size elasticities of household fuel demand is being submitted for publication to the Journal of Development Studies.

Other scientific papers to be published are:

- a) The histology of F. Buski infection in two susceptible snails submitted in Am. J. Tropical Hyg.
- b) Serology of Giardia in Bangladesh submitted in Journal of infectious Diseases.
- c) Single dose Piperazine Therapy for Ascariasis. No effect on growth in a community study has been published in Am. J. Clin. Nutr. 81.

3. Rationale:

The present data collection will be helpful for comparison of S.E.S. and demographic characteristic of an urban fringe village "transition village". These data are not available from the Matlab series. Moreover, this limited study will also allow the students of I.S.R.T. to prepare thesis for their Master of Demography Degree from this data set. The specific topics of the students will be presented separately.

B. SPECIFIC AIMS:

The specific objectives of the study will be to collect base line data on the following aspects:

- (a) to assess the socio-demographic pattern of the village.
- (b) to have detailed picture of the development programmes of the village: such as communication, institutions, welfare activities, modern approach in agriculture sector etc.

C. METHODOLOGY:

(i) Study area: Nandipara, a transition village which is about 6.5 kms. east of the centre place of Dhaka city has been selected as the site of this study.

Total population is about 2,000 consisting of about 450 holds, the unit of the study will be the households and all the households of the village will be studied.

Three Masters of Demography students of ISRT, D.U. will be the interviewers where work will be supervised by Dr. Asma Islam and Dr. M. Moslehuddin. The respondent will be the household heads but in case of absence of the Head, his wife or any other well informed person of the family will be taken as the respondent.

(ii) Data Collection Procedure: Data will be collected by administering a standardized questionnaire. The questionnaire will be pretested before administering the task of the data collection. The questionnaire would contain both structured and unstructured type of questions (see appendix).

Data Processing:

The collected data will be processed by computer. The necessary editing, coding and verification will be made before taking the data to the computer.

Data Analysis:

Tabulated data will be analysed using different statistical measurements, e.g. percentage, central tendency, dispersion, co-efficient of correlation, significance test, like t, F, . . . The mentioned statistical tests will be applied depending on the appropriateness of the data.

D. SIGNIFICANCE:

The aim of the study is to have a census and data on demography & S.E.S. in a sense to update the census, and note the changes of the above characteristics of this transition village where data are lacking.

E. FACILITIES REQUIRED:

- 1. Office space: present office space for Dr. Asma and Dr. Mosleuddin will be used.
- 2. Use of I.C.D.D.R.B., computer facilities.

F. COLLABORATIVE ARRANGEMENTS

Dr. Mosleuddin from I.S.R.T University of Dhaka has agreed to collaborate on this study. The demographic (including fertility) and S.E.S. data will be used by three students of Dr. Mosleuddin for M.A. Thesis. These students will also be working with this protocol.
